Cascade AIDS Project Executive Director Steps Down

Portland, OR (April 18, 2008) – After two years as executive director of Cascade AIDS Project (CAP) in Portland, Jean Ann Van Krevelen has resigned her position to work as a private consultant and to spend more time with her family, announced CAP Board President Trever Cartwright.

The CAP board has begun a nation-wide search to find an executive director with the experience and skills necessary to replace Ms. Van Krevelen and lead the CAP team in its important work with people affected and infected by HIV/AIDS. It will name an interim executive director in the next week.

“CAP has a strong management team and an outstanding staff committed to its mission and programs,” said Mr. Cartwright. “Our programs and services will continue uninterrupted.”

Cascade AIDS Project leads efforts to prevent new HIV infections, care for people affected and infected by HIV/AIDS, educate communities to eliminate stigma and shame, and advocate for immediate action in combating the pandemic.
