DATE: FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 6th

LOCATION: CAP, 520 NW Davis Street, Suite 215

Supply Pack-up at CAP: 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM, 6 Volunteers

Assist with loading prizes, event supplies on truck to prepare for Walk load in. Meet at CAP's office!

Event Set Up: 6:00 PM-9:00 PM, 10 Volunteers

Unload supply truck, set tables, chairs, flags, banners, trash cans, barricades. Meet at Fields Park! Lifting is required.

DATE: SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 7th

LOCATION: Fields Park, NW 11th & Overton St

Event Set Up: 6:00 AM-9:00 AM, 10 Volunteers

Set linens, deliver prizes to Prize Booth, deliver swag to Retail Booth, final tasks. Some lifting is required.

Volunteer Booth: 7:00 AM-2:00 PM, 2 Volunteers FULL!

Meet, greet, and sign in ALL event volunteers coming and going for their shifts. Distribute event T-shirts and any needed supplies, check radios in/out, set up and break down the Volunteer Booth.

\$1000 Fundraiser Brunch Greeter: 7:00 AM-9:30 AM, 6 Volunteers FULL!

Welcome and direct Walk of Famers, sponsors, political leaders and honored guests at this recognition breakfast prior to the Walk.

Bartender at \$1000 Fundraiser Brunch: 7:00 AM-9:30 AM, 2 Volunteers

Set up Champagne bar area, pour champagne for guests attending the Brunch. Current OLCC card required.

Registration: 7:00 AM-12:00 PM, 16 Volunteers

Welcome and register Walkers. Collect and document all donations. Registration Volunteers must attend a training one week prior to the Walk. Prior customer service experience is preferred.

Prize Booth: 7:00 AM-12:00 PM, 12 Volunteers

Distribute appropriate prizes to Walkers based on their fundraising totals. (Ask Walkers to use their own smart phones to confirm the prize level they achieved). Set up and breakdown booth.

Retail Booth: 7:00 AM-12:00 PM, 3 Volunteers FULL!

Raise money for CAP through sale of t-shirts, awareness bracelets, etc. Set up and breakdown booth.

Food Booth: 7:00 AM-12:00 PM, 5 Volunteers

Display fruit and pre-packaged snacks, refill as needed. Set up and breakdown booth. *Current Food Handler's card is required*.



Kid's Corner: 7:00 AM-12:00 PM, 6 Volunteers FULL!

Greet families and assist kids with arts & crafts. Promote safety for parents, guardians, and youth. Set up and breakdown Kid's Corner toys and/or supplies. Answer basic questions about the Walk.

First Aid: 7:30 AM-12:00 PM. 2 Volunteers FULL!

Provide First Aid to participants as needed throughout the day.

Team Photo Assistant: 7:30 AM-12:00 PM, 2 Volunteers

Greet and gather AIDS Walk teams for their professional team photos. (Photo kiosk provided.)

Candid Photographer: 7:30 AM-11:00 AM, 1 Volunteer

Take candid pictures of AIDS Walk participants, presenters & performers on stage, booths, and Walkers along the route. Option to use CAP's camera equipment or your own gear!

Greeters: 7:30 AM-12:00 PM, 6 Volunteers

Greet and direct walkers entering the park. Answer basic questions about event and logistics.

Line Monitors: 7:30 AM-12:00 PM, 4 Volunteers

Welcome guests as they approach Registration and Prize Booth areas. Direct walkers to correct lines, keep lines moving. Be ready to answer basic questions about the event.

Route Monitors: 8:00 AM-12:00 PM, 30 Volunteers

Cheer on Walkers from a designated spot and promote safety along the route, especially at all TriMet crossings. Provide basic directions and event info as necessary. Excellent group volunteer activity!

Water Stations: 8:00 AM-12:00 PM, 16 Volunteers FULL!

Hand out water and collect empty bottles for recycling. Set up and breakdown water stations (there are several along the route).

Green Team: 9:00 AM-1:30 PM, 4 Volunteers

Empty trash and recycling receptacles throughout the Park, replacing bags as needed. Perform periodic sweeps of the Park during and after the event. Gloves will be provided!

Tear Down: 11:30 AM-2:00 PM, 15 Volunteers

Breakdown booths, load trucks, return supplies to office and sweep the park after the walk. Excellent group volunteer activity! *Some lifting is required*.
